Judging: Following Dairy & Market Showmanship
Exhibits Released: Mon., March 10 - 6 am to noon
Entry Fee: \$25 for first entry, \$5 per class, per division thereafter (includes showmanship)

1. All animals to be sifted for health.
2. All animals are to be registered Does.
3. All animals must have 60 day ownership.
4. Animals must be clean and show evidence of clipping within three weeks prior to the show.
5. All animals must be tattooed prior to arrival on the Fairgrounds and free of excess ink. All tattoos must match registration papers *exactly*. Any discrepancies at the time of the tattoo check will result in immediate disqualification. Junior kids are allowed to have registration papers pending.
6. All goats must be free of horns (disbudded, naturally polled, dehorned). Small scurs will be accepted.
7. All dairy goats must be enrolled in the Scrapie Eradication program. This requires individual identification. See State Rules, page 62 – Sheep and Goat Health Rules.
8. Each exhibitor is limited to 16 animals per division.
9. Group classes limited to one entry per sire or dam per exhibitor. All animals must be owned by the exhibitor and exhibited in an individual class to be eligible for groups.
10. Milking stanchions and grooming equipment will be restricted to designated areas.
11. Exhibitors needing to dispose of milk shall do so only in the wash racks. Dumping of milk down any other drains will result in loss of premiums.
12. Milkers must be milking or accompanied by a valid service memo.
13. Stall cards must be displayed above stall or pen.
14. Animals are not eligible for auction.

JUNIOR HORSE

Horse Showmanship: Open to Junior residents of Imperial County

Entries Close: Fri., January 30, 2009 - 4 p.m.
Exhibits Received: Fri., February 27, 8 a.m.
Judging: Fri., February 27, 9 a.m.
Showmanship: Fri., February 27, 9 a.m.
Exhibits Released: At conclusion of show
Entry Fee: \$25.00 **per horse** for 1st entry and \$5.00 for each class thereafter.

1. No stallions are permitted.
2. Horses/Ponies must be leased or owned by exhibitor or exhibitor's family for at least 120 days prior to opening day of the fair. Registration/proof of ownership shall be submitted to the fair no later 120 days before the first day of the fair. This includes 4-H and FFA.
3. Exhibitors must enter the appropriate class in the division by the close of entries.
4. All patterns will be posted one hour prior to the beginning of the show.
5. Exhibitor must be on hand and ready to exhibit at the time called for judging. Those exhibitors with conflicting fair show schedules (i.e. rabbits, cavy, chicken or pigs) must notify the ring steward and an **attempt** will be made to accommodate their schedule. Discretion is left solely with the judge and the decision of the judge will be final.
6. All animals must be on the grounds by 8:00 a.m. on Friday, February 27, 2009, regardless of class entered.
7. When leaving the show area, please leave quietly as the loading and moving of trailers is disruptive to those still showing.
8. Helmets meeting ASTM/SEI approved protective headgear must be worn in all horse events.
9. Horses can be shown either Western or English in Trail division.

10. In the event of rain, Horse Showmanship Classes will be held at an alternate location at the IV Expo grounds. The Junior Horse Show classes (mounted classes) will be cancelled and rescheduled for a later date to be announced.

Division 430: Junior Horse Showmanship*

- Class 1: 4-H Junior Novice ** – ages 9 -14
- Class 2: 4-H Junior Exhibitors – 9 -14 years old (not in high school)
- Class 3: 4-H and FFA Senior Novice ** – 14 years old and over and in high school
- Class 4: 4-H Senior Exhibitors – 14 years old and over and in high school
- Class 5: FFA – 14 years old and over and in high school

*Note: this is the only place to enter Horse Showmanship

** Novice classes are only for those that have never shown a horse before. First place novice exhibitors in Class 1 may move to Class 2 and First place senior novice exhibitor in Class 3 may move to Class 4 or 5 depending on group affiliation.

11. Horse Showmanship

- a. See Showmanship section for complete rules
- b. Only open to residents of Imperial County
- c. Attire: **No** horse show clothes; exhibitors must wear the official 4-H or FFA uniform (including white shirt and **white** pants); an ASC-ASTM approved helmet and boots.
- d. Criteria: Exhibitors will be judged on their ability of presenting his or her horse to the judge, cleanliness and grooming of the exhibitor and horse and control of the animal.
- e. Horses may not be shared by family members or any other exhibitors.
- f. 1st and 2nd place winners of Class 2, 4 and 5, eligible to go to Round Robin, must make a horse available, and attend the Large Animal Round Robin practice held Monday, March 2, 2009 from 5-7 p.m.
- g. Horse showmanship will receive Rosettes 1-8 and Premium 1-4.

Junior Fair Horse Show Schedule

1. The State and Local Rules found elsewhere in the book apply to this Department. Please review the Horse Show Department section prior to submitting your entry form
2. Eligibility: Same as Horse Showmanship Class above.
3. Judging: Classes will be judged under the American System. USA Equestrian (www.usef.org) and California State Fairs 4H & FFA Horse Show rules will apply to the Pleasure, Trail and Horsemanship classes.
4. Tack Requirements: USA Equestrian (www.usef.org) rules will be followed for Pleasure, Trail and Horsemanship classes.
5. Appropriate show clothes will be required. Uniform should be neat and clean. A white long sleeve shirt, white long pants, belt and boots and/or the official 4-H or FFA uniform shall be worn. ASTM/SEI approved protective headgear is required. All participants in all classes will be judged on a neat, clean appearance.

6. Ribbons and Awards: Ribbons will be awarded 1st – 8th place for Division 431-436 for each class. Premiums will be paid 1st – 4th place for each class.
7. Management reserves the right to combine or cancel any classes in which, in its judgment, the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition.

1. Animals shall be clean.
2. Hooves shall not be longer than 1/8-inch from sole.
3. Animals must be free of unsightly medical disorders.
4. Flock numbers will be used to identify all animals. Numbers shall be on regular and practical tags attached to the ear or tattooed in the ear. Exhibitor may not use the same flock number on more than one animal during two consecutive calendar years.
5. Registration numbers may not be used as flock numbers.
6. All breeding sheep must be enrolled in the Scrapie Eradication program. This requires individual identification. See State Rules, page 62 – Sheep and Goat Health Rules.
7. LAMBS MUST SHOW LAMBS' TEETH.
8. Ewes entered in the market sheep division may not be exhibited in the breeding division and vice versa. Violation of this rule will exclude the exhibitor from competition in all departments of the fair.
9. **Exhibitors must submit a form of ID with each entry as by state rules. If not submitted by close of entry, a \$5.00 fee will be charged. (See State Rules, Pg. 59, #27, A-C.)**
10. Stall Cards must be displayed above stall.
11. AMERICAN SYSTEM OF JUDGING
12. State Rule – **Tail Docking.** To qualify for exhibit market lambs must be docked such that the tail (dock) is healed and can be lifted from the exterior. Lambs that have no dock will not be eligible..

1. Animals shall have feet trimmed. Excessive hoof length shall be grounds for disqualification.
2. Animals must be clean.
3. Animals must be lice free. Animals suffering unsightly wounds or medical disorders shall be disqualified. Exhibitor may be asked to remove disqualified animals from the grounds. Determination will be made by the livestock superintendent.
4. Boars may not be used for showmanship.
5. Draw ear notching on entry form and use numbers to identify notching.
6. Gilts entered in the market swine division may not be exhibited in the breeding division and vice-versa. Any violation of this rule will exclude the exhibitor from competition in all departments of the fair.

1. Only registered does and wethers may be shown.
2. All animals must have a tattoo or microchip. Tattoo or microchip must match registration or ownership papers exactly. No exceptions. If microchip is used, the owner must provide a microchip scanner at time of livestock check in. Any discrepancies with the tattoo or microchip, whether at check in or during the show, will result in immediate disqualification. Junior kids are allowed to have registration pending.
3. Animals must be free of horns (disbudded, naturally polled, dehorned).

4. Age is determined by first day of Fair.
5. Minimum ownership - 60 days prior to start of fair (except kids born to animals meeting ownership requirement).
6. All animals to be sifted for health.
7. All pygmy goats must be enrolled in the Scrapie Eradication program. This requires individual identification. See State Rules, page 62 – Sheep and Goat Health Rules.
8. Each exhibitor is limited to 8 animals per division, if room is available. IVE has the right to alter or change this provision.
9. All animals must show evidence of grooming within three weeks of the Fair.
10. All animals must be pre-registered, same date as market goat project.
11. Animals not eligible for auction.
12. Stall cards must be displayed above stall.
